
Harriet Ziefert – Author




Emily Bolam – Illustrator



This Buzzy adventure portrays the common childhood experience of focusing on a single new toy and having to learn to move on when that toy breaks or is lost.




It's time for bed, and Buzzy's not ready. Can you help Buzzy get to sleep with his teddy?




Buzzy is going to the beach. The ocean is big and he's a little frightened.


